

Overview

The mission of the Sacramento State, College of Continuing Education (CCE) Paramedic Program is to provide excellent and innovative education that prepares paramedics to meet the needs of a diverse community. The students are prepared for roles as clinicians, advocates, educators and leaders in the changing prehospital health care system. The program leaders believe in creating an environment in which faculty and students pursue the knowledge of prehospital care guided by the program's core values. The College of Continuing Education sent an online survey out on August 24, 2017 to students from five cohorts (13-1, 14-1,14-2, 15-1,15-2) to assess the quality of the Paramedic Program and how to best meet students' needs in the future.

Results

The following report details the 2017 Paramedic Program survey results. There were a total of 121 students who were invited to take the survey, of which, two opted out and 72 participated in the survey (response rate = 60.5%). Response rate by cohort and overall are reported in table 1.

Figure 1. Did you successfully complete the Sacramento State College of Continuing Education EMT Course? (n = 72)





Figure 2. Where did you successfully complete your EMT course? (n = 32)




Figure 3. Are You a Licensed Paramedic? (n = 72)

93.1% (n = 67) of the respondents are already licensed paramedics, and 6.9% (n = 5) are not currently licensed (Figure 3). The respondents who are not currently licensed were asked if they plan to become a licensed paramedic. 100.0% (n = 5) of the respondents who are not currently licensed, plan to become licensed in the next 0-6 months.








Figure 5. Are you employed as a licensed paramedic? (n = 67)

Figure 6. How long did it take you to get employed as a licensed paramedic after you completed the Paramedic Program at Sacramento State? (n = 57)








Figure 7. How long have you worked as a Licensed Paramedic? (n = 57)


